How To Enter:	
High School:	<p>“If Black History Had Social Media”</p> <p>Create a mock Instagram or Facebook post as if it existed during a moment in Black history <i>or</i> for a Black historical figure.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Focus may include activism, innovation, culture, education, or everyday life• Visuals may be real images, original drawings, screenshots, or digital designs• Creativity is encouraged <p>Requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• 2–4 total posts (each post = one image or slide with short caption)• A summary (minimum 500 words) explaining:<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ The historical context○ The message being communicated○ Why this moment or figure still matters today
Middle School:	<p>“Group Chat With History”</p> <p>Create a mock group chat conversation between Black historical figures <i>or</i> between students and a Black historical figure.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Chats may be handwritten or digital• Messages should include historical facts, personality, and appropriate humor• Creativity is encouraged <p>Requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Minimum 10–15 messages• One written explanation (minimum 500 words) explaining:<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Who is in the chat○ The historical moment or topic being represented

**Elementary
School:**

“Build It!”

Build something inspired by a Black inventor or leader.

- May use items such as LEGOS, blocks, cardboard, or recycled materials, etc.
- Creation should be labeled with the inventor’s name or idea
- Creativity is encouraged

Requirements:

- Student shares two paragraphs (spoken or written) explaining:
 - What they built
 - Who or what inspired it

OR

“Story Time With Black History”

Create a superhero-style story based on a real Black historical figure.

Your story should turn the historical figure into a superhero while including real facts about their life or accomplishments.

Entry Options:

- Write a short story
- OR create a picture book with dialogue or text (3–4 pages)

Requirements:

- Must be based on a real Black historical figure
- Minimum 300 words if submitting a short story
- Include a minimum of 4 real facts about the person if submitting a picture book
- Pictures are encouraged
