FIVE IMPORTANT REASONS WHY CHRISTIANS SHOULD STUDY THE WORD

From Global University

Theology may sound like a fancy word to some Christians, and many feel its intellectual pursuits are best left up to pastors and professors. But theology isn't just for academics—because the discipline centers on deepening your knowledge of God, it is rewarding for all Christians to study.

Theology is defined as the study of religious faith, practice, and experience. More beautifully described by Saint Anselm of Canterbury, it is “faith seeking understanding.”

1. Deepen Your Knowledge of God. The central pursuit of theology is to better understand God's nature and how He works in the world. Jesus calls us to “Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind” (Mathew 22:37). You can't truly love someone without knowing them, so the process of studying theology will deepen your love for God and strengthen your relationship with Him.

2. Defend Your Faith. Every day, all over the world, Christians are challenged by others to defend their faith. This is why it's vitally important for Christians to know not only what they believe but why they believe it. Theology seeks to understand the central beliefs of Christianity from all angles, using real-world examples and preparing you to intelligently defend your beliefs when the need arises.

3. Gain Knowledge of Other Disciplines To contend with difficult questions of God's existence and nature; theology must call upon other disciplines such as history and philosophy. Studying theology provides the opportunity to learn the history of Jesus and early Christianity and the philosophy behind apologetics—a branch of theology that defends the truth of the Bible against objections.

4. Strengthen Community Bonds You can't study theology in a vacuum. You need experienced teachers and mentors to help guide you along the way. Studying theology with others in a group or academic setting will help you make long-lasting connections with fellow Christians.

5. Learn to Live Your Faith Because theology will deepen your knowledge of the Christian faith and apply it to real-world situations, it will prepare you to follow a more Christ-centered path. The philosophical and historical perspectives it offers will help grow your trust in God and His plan for you.

The Christian Education Ministry

Happy New Year! Greetings from the New Hope Missionary Baptist Church Christian Education Ministry. No matter where you are on your spiritual journey, we are here to help you on your pathway to becoming a mature Christian. The Christian Education Ministry supported by the Council of Christian Education is charged to establish and administer a religious education program for the church under the direction of the Pastor and the Director of Christian Education. The religious education program covers infants, children, youth, young adults, adults, and senior adults. The Mission of the Christian Education Ministry is to carry out the vision and mission of the Pastor and the church. That is, "To provide spiritual and practical teaching, preaching, and disciple training for the perfecting of the members of NHMBC so they can do the work of the ministry." Spiritual equipping and discipleship training in the church are vital components in the process through which believers are prepared and empowered to fulfill their divine purpose and serve within the community. The Christian Education Ministry is purposed to help individuals from the beginning of their discipleship journey where they are introduced to Jesus Christ and then set on a pathway of spiritual growth and maturity in Christ. The discipleship journey at New Hope is intended to be comprehensive but simple. Our discipleship process consists of **Hope, Healing, Handoffs, and Help**:

Build **HOPE** (Weekly and Special Worship Services and Bible Classes)

Seek **HEALING** (ROOTED/ Life Empowerment Communities)

Empowering **HANDOFFS** (New Members Orientation and Christian Education Classes)

Joyfully **HELP** (Ministering to Others)

The specific ministries involved in this endeavor include the New Members Orientation, Discipleship, and Spiritual Gifts Training; Sunday School; ROOTED Discipleship Training; Life Empowerment Groups; New Hope MBC-Southfield Bible Institute; Biblical Counseling Training/Christian Research and Development Institute (CRD); the Pastor's weekly Bible Study, and monthly Bible Studies conducted by the Women of Hope, the Mountain Moving Men, the Anchors of Hope, and the Youth Ministry; and Annual and Quarterly Leadership Training Meetings.

Christian Education classes and training for January–March 2026:

New Members Orientation, Discipleship, and Spiritual Gifts Training (ongoing)

All NEW MEMBERS are required to complete a series of twelve (12) Biblical Classes. There are eight (8) Church Orientation Classes and four (4) Spiritual Gift Classes. The four (4) Spiritual Gift Classes are designed to assist you in identifying your Spiritual Gift (s). and what Church ministries are available for you to join and exercise your gift (s). These classes are held every **4th Saturday of each month from 9:00 a.m-1:00 p.m.** All twelve (12) classes are scheduled on each 4th Saturday with the exception of November and December. The maximum number of classes that can be taken at a Saturday session is four (4). Individuals may take classes on Sunday during the Sunday School hour from 9:30 am to 10:30 am by appointment only. Sunday School

Sunday School is held each **Sunday from 9:30 am to 10:30 am**. There are several adult classes, a young adult class, and several Youth Ministry Sunday School classes. Through the Holy Spirit, prayer, and a Bible-based curriculum, an engaging weekly study of God's Word is offered to assist Sunday school participants in learning and applying biblical commands, teachings, and instructions for Christian living. To re-enforce learning, we practice the 3 Rs:

- What is my **reaction** to what I read?
- What is the **relevance** of what I read?
- What is my **responsibility** in applying what I read?

Restoring Hope, Help, and Healing Through Biblical Counseling

Our Mission: Our mission in Biblical Counseling is to guide individuals in restoring their relationship with God and others through Scripture and God's grace, offering hope that leads to spiritual wholeness.

Our Vision: We aim to be windows of Hope, Help, and Healing in the community, providing Christ-centered counsel that renews minds and restores hearts.

How We Fulfill the Vision: We do this by counseling with care, training and supervising others, and supporting the hurting.

What We Do: We equip counselors to serve our church family and community to use the word of God to counsel life's challenges.

Equipping Believers to Counsel Biblically: Through New Hope's Biblical Counseling Training Institute, believers are prepared to serve by counseling faithfully within the Body of Christ.

A four-level program offering progressive learning and practice: BC-1 (self-confrontation), BC-2 (counseling skills), BC-3 (supervised practice), and BC-4 (advanced training with internship). BC-1–3 are prerequisites for BC-4, which includes hands-on counseling alongside a Senior Counselor.

A Testimony of Transformation –Sister Barbra Gentry-Pugh, Lead BC1 Instructor and Published Author

Sister Gentry-Pugh, entered biblical counseling training reluctantly after seminary, believing she was “finished with classes.” Yet God was preparing her for a deeply transformative season. Through Scripture, faithful teaching, and the Spirit's gentle conviction, He exposed a long-avoided family wound she had chosen to ignore. As the Lord revealed her need for reconciliation, she obeyed; one conversation, one prayer at a time. Walls fell, healing began, and restoration took root. Her story reflects what we witness each year: God mending what was broken through His truth and grace.

We also provide workshops that strengthen and edify the church body, covering topics such as Premarital Preparation, Grief Support, and more.



Celebrating Our 2025 Achievements

As we reflect on the past year, we are thrilled to share that our class achieved a remarkable accomplishment during the calendar year 2025. Together, participants in the Biblical Weight Management Ministry recorded a total weight loss of 248 lbs.

This collective success is a testament to our dedication, perseverance, and the supportive environment fostered within our group.

Looking Ahead: Sustaining Success in 2026

As we enter 2026, we are seeking God's guidance to help us maintain the weight loss we have achieved together. While we recognize that occasional weight fluctuations may occur, we are committed to utilizing the practical strategies we have learned throughout our journey. These include making healthier food choices—such as selecting baked or broiled options instead of fried foods, choosing fruit instead of desserts, opting for vegetables over starchy foods, incorporating whole grains rather than white flour products, and preferring low-fat milk products over whole milk. Additionally, we focus on increasing our physical activity, reducing our sodium intake, and ensuring we meet our daily water requirements.

Guidance and Continued Support

Our founder and motivational leader, Pat Clark, will continue to guide us through the program that has enabled us to shed unwanted pounds. Building on this foundation, we will also emphasize the following areas for ongoing improvement:

- Reading food labels to monitor portion sizes and nutritional content
- Shopping for healthier alternatives to high-fat and high-calorie products
- Learning cooking techniques that help reduce fat and sodium
- Following overall guidelines for healthy living

Inspirational Meetings and Exercise

Our meetings are always designed to inspire, uplift, and encourage each participant. Before we end with prayer, Linella Stewart guides us through a 10–15-minute exercise routine, helping us care for both our physical and spiritual well-being.
